PROCLAMATION PROCLAIMING MAY 15, 2014 THROUGH JUNE 15, 2014 AS TOURETTE SYNDROME AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, Good health is a key component of a long, productive and fulfilling life; and

WHEREAS, supporting observances that raise awareness about serious neurological disorders, such as Tourette Syndrome (TS), offer individuals with Tourette Syndrome and their families an opportunity to educate the public about this disorder, and to advocate for all the needs of children and families who live with Tourette Syndrome; and

WHEREAS, Tourette Syndrome is an inherited neurological disorder, characterized by involuntary and sudden movements and repeated vocal sounds, called "tics." TS can strike people of all ethics and racial backgrounds, with males effected three to four times more often than females; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 2% of the population in the United States may have TS, and due to a lack of information and understanding about the disorder, many thousands remain untreated and undiagnosed. This lack of public awareness has also increased the social stigma attached to TS; and

WHEREAS, Tourette Syndrome typically begins in childhood, with 1 in 100 school-age boys and 1 in 300-400 school-age girls affected, with symptoms generally appearing before age 10, and sometimes requiring lifelong treatment; and

WHEREAS, There is no known cure for Tourette Syndrome and early diagnosis and treatment of TS can prevent physical and psychological harm; and

WHEREAS, it is important to increase awareness, understanding and support for Tourette Syndrome.
